Katlijn Malfliet is research director at the Institute for International and European Policy. Her research activities deal mainly with the development of post-communist political and legal transition processes in Central and Eastern Europe.

She focuses in particular on the competition between two major discourses: the rational traditions of enlightenment (liberalism-socialism) and post-communist identity politics. Furthermore, she studies the impact of internal transition on foreign policy and on the widening of the European Union.

She also publishes on institutional developments of the Commonwealth of Independent States and other institutions for regional and international cooperation. In her role of research director Katlijn Malfliet supervises the research on Central and Eastern Europe conducted at the Institute for International and European Policy.

She also leads the Chair InBev-Baillet Latour, a programme focused on the relations between the European Union and Russia, and coordinates a Joint European Project with the University of Kazan in Tatarstan (Russia) in the field of International relations and European Policy. She is member of the consortium group of a similar project with the University of Dnepropetrovsk (Ukraine).
